## **NCDKG Convention Registration and Hotel**

The 2023 NC DKG Convention registration and all convention events will be at the Hilton Greenville April 28-30, 2023. Located beside the Hilton Greenville is the Holiday Inn where we have 90 rooms reserved for NC DKG members at \$129 per night. Cut off date for this rate is March 22, 2023. We need to fill those 90 rooms to receive meeting rooms at no charge and other convention support.

To book your Holiday Inn room online, go to the hotel website <u>Delta Kappa Gamma Online Booking Link</u>, which is automatically linked to the group code DKG. At the top of the page, click 04/27/2023 - 04/29/2023 to change the dates, number of rooms, and number of guests. Then click Search. Scroll down and select room preference - one king or two queen beds. Enter payment information, accept the Terms and Conditions, and click Book Room. You may also call the Holiday Inn at 252-355-3800. The Holiday Inn is located at 203 SW Greenville Blvd, Greenville, NC.

## **Quality Entertainment Announced for Convention**

Entertainment for Friday, April 28 will be the Carolina Chord Connection, based in Greenville. It is a chapter of the Barbershop Harmony Society. The mixed chorus sings a capella (without instrumental accompaniment) arrangements of traditional and contemporary songs. Elaine Yontz, a member of Delta Xi, is a member of this group that will sing on Friday.

Entertainment for Saturday, April 29, will be students from the Littleton Academy Drum Circle in Littleton. Their teacher, Diane Colin, Gamma Chi Chapter, received funds from the Maxine and Don McCall Grant from the NC DKG Educational Foundation to purchase and upgrade drums. The Drum Circle will play Native American, African, and Caribbean music.

## **NC DKG Spring Convention Project Announced**

The April 28-30, 2023 NC DKG Convention Project is collecting food and monetary funds for the Food Bank of the Albemarle located in Elizabeth City. The Food Bank of the Albemarle helps fight hunger and poverty in northeast NC, serving Beaufort, Bertie, Camden, Chowan, Currituck, Dare, Gates, Hertford, Hyde, Martin, Northampton, Pasquotank, Perquimans, Tyrrell, and Washington counties.

The Food Bank is collecting canned items such as meats, proteins, vegetables, fruits and soups; dry goods such as pasta, cereal, rice and dried beans. In addition to food items, toiletries, personal hygiene items, toilet tissue, and laundry soap are very much needed to help families and cannot obtained with food stamp benefits.
