Directions from Charlotte/Huntersville/Davidson:

Take Interstate 485 Outer

Take Exit 57 at Providence Road/North Carolina 16 toward Weddington/Waxhaw Proceed into North Carolina 16 South/Providence Road

At the stoplight in downtown Waxhaw, turn left and proceed approximately one mile. Museum is located on the right in a large wooded area.

Directions from Concord and Matthews:

Take Interstate 485 Inner

Take Exit 57 for Providence Road/North Carolina toward Weddington/Waxhaw Turn left onto North Carolina 16 South/Providence Road

Proceed approximately 12 miles until you reach the stoplight in downtown Waxhaw, and turn left on Highway 75 (Waxhaw Highway)

Proceed approximately one mile on Highway75 (Waxhaw Highway) and the museum is on the right in a large wooded area.

Directions from Marshville/Wingate/Monroe

Proceed to US 74W and turn left on East Franklin Street.

Make a slight right onto East Jefferson Street

Turn left onto North Charlotte Avenue/NC 200/NC84/NC75

Take the 1st right onto West Franklin Street/NC 84/NC75 and continue to follow NC 75 (Fifth Third Bank is on the corner)

The museum will be approximately 11.4 miles on NC 75 on the left.
