Early Convention Registration Encouraged

Eta State members planning to attend the 2016 Eta State Convention in Winston Salem, April 22-24, are encouraged to make your reservations early. Reservation info for the Marriott is on the Eta State website convention page at http://www.deltakappagamma.org/NC/2016Convention.html.

Eta State may be able to secure more rooms at convention rate if the block fills soon enough, so reserve early.

Rooms are \$119, single or double, plus taxes. Deadline for the group rate is March 22, and as in the past, rooms will go fast so register early. It speeds the check-in process if you will put all names in the room on the initial registration or update it as soon as you know who is rooming together. The hotel puts bills under the door and room charges can be viewed on the room televisions. This will help speed your checkout.

Alpha Zeta December 2015 Meeting

*Our meeting will be held at Cuthbertson High School (1400 Cuthbertson Road, Waxhaw, NC 28173) in the Media Center beginning at <u>9:00 am</u>-remember we are having our famous AZ Christmas Auction!

Here are the driving directions from various other townships:

From Huntersville, NC to 1400 Cuthbertson Road, Waxhaw, NC:

- 1. Get on I-485 Outer from NC-115S/S Old Statesville Road.
- 2. Head south on NC-115 S/S Old Statesville Road toward E Greenway Street.
- 3. Turn left onto the Interstate 485 Outer S/Interstate 77 ramp.
- 4. Keep left to continue on Exit 23A, follow signs for Interstate 77 S/Charlotte.
- Keep left at the fork, follow signs for Interstate 485 Outer S/Spartanburg and merge onto I 485
 Outer.
- 6. Follow I-485 Outer to NC-16 S/Providence Road –take exit 57 from I-485 Outer (will be labeled North Carolina 16/Providence Road toward Weddington/Waxhaw.
- 7. Turn right on NC-16 S/Providence Road and then continue approximately 7.5 miles and at stop light turn left on Cuthbertson Road. School is located approximately 1.9 miles on Cuthbertson Road on the left.

From Wingate and Monroe to 1400 Cuthbertson Road, Waxhaw, NC:

- 1. Head south on Skyway Drive toward North Church Street.
- 2. Turn right at the 1st cross street onto North Church Street.
- 3. Turn left onto North Charlotte Avenue.
- 4. Turn right at the 3rd cross street onto West Franklin Street.
- 5. Slight right onto Weddington Road.
- At the traffic circle, continue straight onto NC-84 W/Weddington Road approximately 3.2 miles.
- 7. Turn left onto Lester Davis Road.
- 8. Turn right onto New Town Road, continue approximately 1.5 miles until you reach a stoplight and turn left at stoplight onto Cuthbertson Road.
- 9. Continue on Cuthbertson Road for approximately 1.0 mile and school is located on your right.

From Matthews to 1400 Cuthbertson Road, Waxhaw, NC:

- 1. Head southeast on West John Street toward Library Lane.
- 2. Turn right onto Potter Road –follow for approximately 4.5 miles
- 3. At the traffic circle, take the 1st exit onto Waxhaw-Indian Trail Road-follow for approximately 2.8 miles.
- 4. Turn right at stop light onto New Town Road-follow approximately % of a mile.
- 5. Turn left at stop light onto Cuthbertson Road-the high school is approximately one mile from this light and will be located on your right.
