"The Only Evidence of Life is GROWTH!"

I have often heard that growth for the sake of growth is counterproductive. I believe that wholeheartedly. But I also believe and have witnessed firsthand the above quote by John O'Leary that "the only evidence of life is growth." The 2019-2021 biennium theme, Ready, Set, GROW!, is my attempt in finding balance with these two statements.

Fund\$ for Florence

The Eta State convention project brought in over \$2,600 in gift cards for our teacher-members still recovering from Hurricane Florence.

Passing of the House

The traditional Passing of the House contributions to Headquarters and table sales of note cards netted over \$2,000 for NC DKG's Headquarters.

State Name Change Adopted

Members attending the state convention in early May voted to pass all the presented amendments to the state *Bylaws* and *Standing Rules*, thus making the name change official—Eta State is now **The North Carolina State Organization** of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International, abbreviated as NC DKG.

The change was part of an alignment of the state documents with the International *Constitution* and *Standing Rules* adopted at the convention last summer in Austin.

Highlights of the convention include attendance by International President Cathy Daugherty, chapter and individual awards, work-shops, vendors, and the Ceremony of Remembrance.

Actions Approved by the International Administrative Board

The DKG Administrative Board took action on several items during its May 2019 meeting. Among the actions were the approval of a recommendation that the 2022 International Convention be held at the Sheraton in New Orleans, Louisiana, during the week of July 10–18, 2022 (pending International Executive Board approval).

They also approved, pending International Executive Board approval, the scheduling of three international conferences in 2021 and made a recommendation that Finland be the site of the 2021 International Conference in Europe.

The Board approved the statement, "All educators who identify as women may be invited to membership," as the Society's inclusivity statement.

The potential merger of the DKG Educational Foundation and the DKG Supporting Corporation received Administrative Board support. An Ad hoc committee was appointed to pursue the merger and an additional ad hoc committee will be charged with developing Bylaws for the new entity. They will report to the Administrative Board at the November 2019 meeting.

The International Administrative Board consists of the International Officers, Regional Directors, Members-at-Large, Area Representatives, Immediate Past President, Parliamentarian, and Executive Director.

The Report from International at the NC DKG Convention in April shared that \$26,684 for scholarships were given to NC members last year. North Carolina has received \$131,200 for Cornetet grants, seminar attendants, and project |winners. Sixty-four members have received \$363,300 in scholarships.

Tech Tip

A Fillable Forms Primer

Collection of information via pdf forms or fillable forms is increasing. These forms allow the user to enter information directly into them, and as in the case of the Chapter Achievement Award form, it even calculates the points! Then send the form directly to the committee or person who needs the information.

Fillable forms work great but it's not always intuitive to get through the process. Here are some tips from Webmaste, Beth Winstead on using these fillable forms:

Find the form you need on the website, usually on the forms page-https://www.ncdkg.org/forms.html.

1. Download form to your computer. This is key – you cannot just fill the form out from the page.

2. Save the form on your computer – Note the location YOUR computer uses to save the forms. For some this could be a folder named download, for some the desktop, etc. You can also choose where to put it.

- 3. Open and fill out the downloaded form.
- 4. Save the form again on your computer.
- 5. Open an email and attach the form to send to the person to whom it is to be submitted.
