Did you know that nearly 15 million Americans—one in 10 adults—experience depression each year? Major depression affects your **mood**, **mind**, **body**, **and behavior** and about two-thirds of those impacted don't get the help they need.

Women experience **twice the rate of depression as men, regardless of race or ethnic background**. An estimated one woman in eight will contend with a major depression in her lifetime. (http://www.networkofcare.org/library/womenanddepression.pdf)

DKG News to Become Online Only

The July/August issue of DKG News is now online.

The summer issue has traditionally been online only but at the May Administrative Board meeting, the board voted to eliminate all print issues and retain the online versions, so there will be no more printed and mailed copies.

Rising printing and mailing costs and declining DKG membership caused the board to find ways to cut costs. Five print issues of *DKG News* a year cost the Society over \$115,000.
