A New Look for Eta State News

This month members will get two links to the Winter edition of Eta State News. One will be the pdf file like usual and one will be a swf file.

Swf is an abbreviation for small web format, an Adobe Flash file format used for multimedia, vector graphics and ActionScript. In the case of Eta State News, the Flash format allows animation of the page turning and allows a two-page view of the inside of the newsletter, plus search-ing options, thumbnail views, and an

Several other states are using swf files to share newsletters and Eta State News Editor Carol Bostian explored bringing the new format to North Carolina. "The new swf format for the Eta State News allows members an additional, 21st

century option for reading the state newsletter. It helps Eta State to be a leader in communication formats," said Carol.

To use the swf file, follow the link to Flipbuilder, the online tool Carol used to convert the pdf file into an interactive media file. Click on the arrows or anywhere on the far sides of the pages to flip to the next page.

Educational Law & Policy Committee Urges Organized Action

We have almost two months before the full General Assembly returns to Raleigh on Wednesday, January 10, for a special session. This is a perfect time to let every legislator know that supporters of excellent public schools in North Carolina are very concerned by last year's unfunded mandate by the General Assembly that class sizes in K – 3rd grade class-rooms be lowered. While lowering K – 3 class sizes is a worthy goal, it takes money to do that. The state did not provide such funding and additionally added that school systems could not use any of their state teacher allotment funds for art, music, world languages or physical education teachers. Local school systems also do not have the capital funds needed to provide the actual extra classrooms that lower class sizes will require. Local school systems are scrambling to find ways to do everything that is



required, but it is doubtful that local governments will have sufficient additional funds to provide everything mandated by the state.

The EL&P Committee urges all chapters to organize efforts to draw their legislators' attention to this conundrum faced by school systems across the entire state. Suggested actions for January 10 include emailing respective lawmakers, calling the offices of each and every legislator, visiting the General Assembly in Raleigh and meeting with Senators and Representatives, or signing the petition on this matter provided by the Public Schools First NC organization. An Advocacy Day is being organized for January 10 and Delta Kappa Gamma should let our voice be heard!
