DKG Scholarship

The new DKG International Scholarship application for the 2018-2019 academic year is available on the Forms tab of the International web-site. You will need to be logged in to access it.

Scholarships are available to members who are pursuing doctoral, masters, and other advanced degrees in their field of study—\$6,000 for advanced degrees and \$10,000 toward a doctoral degree.

Members are encouraged to start filling out an application a few months before the next due date, as it will take some careful thought and planning to complete the application packet and collect other required academic documentation.

The deadline is February 1, 2018, to submit the application and all sup-porting documentation. Be sure to follow the directions carefully and complete all sections of the application.

The application is available under the <u>Grants tab</u> on the Foundation website, <u>www.ncdkgef.org.</u>


Six grants of up to \$250 each will again be offered in the literacy/learning projects and the continuing education categories. Read about past awardees and their projects in the brochure on the Giving page.

Educational Law & Policy Committee Seeks School Issues for 2018 Member Survey

For the past few years the Eta State NC Educational Law & Policy Committee has surveyed members to identify which school-related issues are most important. The data gained from this survey is used to compile a White Paper to share with members of the NC General Assembly in Raleigh. The Committee is currently seeking member input about which issues need to be included on the survey for this school year.

Last year's prioritized list included:

- 1) Increase salaries of all educators,
- 2) Continue to provide medical and retirement benefits for all educators,
- 3) Reduce the amount of standardized state testing,
- 4) Hold all schools that receive tax dollars equally accountable for student learning,
- 5) Increase per-pupil funding,
- 6) Oppose public funding of private and religious schools through vouchers,
- 7) Halt the current A-F system of grading public schools,
- 8) Limit the number of charter schools in NC to 170.

Chapter presidents are asked to seek other issues that members wish to include on the state survey. These suggestions should be submitted by October 31 to ELP Chair Susan Phipps at phippss@charter.net.

IPP Groves Nominated as Southeast Regional Director



Eta State NC Immediate Past President Sheila Groves has been nominated as Southeast Regional Director for The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International.

The Eta State NC Executive Board voted at their fall meeting last week to endorse Sheila for this position. Dr. Ann Pember, president of Beta Delta, Sheila's chapter, made the motion for the endorsement.

Sheila is currently serving as a member of the International Leadership Development Committee and helped conduct the trainings at the regional conferences in Hawaii and South Carolina for the new state organization presidents. She has also served on the International Constitution Committee.

Election of new regional directors occurs at the Inter-national Conventions. The 2018 convention will be held in Austin, Texas, July 16-20.

North Carolina to Host International Conference

Eta State NC President Connie Phifer Savell issued a formal invitation to the Southeast Region of DKG International to attend the 2019 conference in North Carolina.
