Supporting early-career educators (SEE) using well-defined programs? What might that look like? When designing a SEE program, chapters might consider getting first-hand feedback from SEE teachers. What are their biggest challenges/obstacles? How can chapters really help? Using their feedback, chapters can then develop outreach projects that fit the needs of SEE teachers and other educators. This can be done by giving time and supplies or by supporting through mentors who can offer advice and encouragement. Check out ways to support SEE educators at all levels. New Grants Available This Year

Grant Applications Due Sept. 30



Two new grants are available this year through the NC DKG Educational Foundation in addition to the grants for projects in Learning/Literacy and for conferences/travel opportunities to support education. September 30 is the deadline to apply for all of them.

The Groves-Little grant is for Early Career Educators, four years or less, in NC public schools, and the McCall grant is for Gifted Education or Fine Arts projects in NC. AP teachers may apply for the McCall grant to fund a classroom project.




DKG Emergency Fund is Here
