The Chapter Presidents' ASK meetings are back with a new meaning. The Regional Directors and Vice Presidents met to consider a rebranding of the name and to discuss input from the chapter presidents about topics to be presented. The Regional Directors agreed to keep ASK as the name associated with the meetings, but it now stands for:

S—Share Ideas and Feedback

Request from DKG International Concerning Websites

President Hilda recently received the following request from Nita Scott, Executive Director of DKG:

"Recently, there have been actions which have caused great concern resulting from postings on several different social media and web sites affiliated with but not managed by the International Society. In general, owners of creative content are growing increasingly intolerant regarding the misuse of intellectual property. As a result, recent incidents related to such misuse by entities at various levels within our organization have resulted in both actualized and potential liabilities to the Society.

"Therefore, the Administrative Board and counsel have approved the placement of a notice on DKG affiliated internet sites (including social media accounts, such as Facebook) that we hope will defray liability and protect the Society. We want to support the continued use of the DKG name and logo by members, chapters, and state organizations. However, we also cannot and do not wish to monitor the many affiliated sites in order to identify potential liability and risk. Please note the attached disclaimer statement (also provided in Spanish for use by Spanish speaking entities) that we request be posted on any website or social media site that bears the DKG Society International name (including "DKG" or the DKG logo)."

NC DKG Webmaster Deb Christensen has already applied the disclaimer in the footer of the NC DKG website and pinned it to the featured post area of the NC DKG Facebook page. The English version of the disclaimer is posted below; the Spanish version can be provided if you need it for your chapter's webpage and social media sites. Please implement this disclaimer as quickly as possible.
